Welcome to the 2021-22 Curling Season!

It's been a tough year and a half since the world changed in mid-March 2020. We have made the tough but responsible decision to require that members must be fully vaccinated or may be accommodated (with conditions) if they cannot be. With the other best practices we have in place (similar to last year), we believe we are providing a very safe environment for all. Hopefully there is some light at the end of the tunnel, and we can look forward to as much normalcy as possible!

The curling season will officially start on Tuesday October 12. We have lots planned at the club before that though, starting with our registration events on September 10 and 11. Hopefully lots of members (new and returning) will plan to attend. Please mark the dates on your calendar.

We are in the process of hiring a bartender who will tend bar for most evening leagues, as well as for bonspiels, CurlON events and rentals. The bar for daytime and ladies' leagues will be managed by the convenors. If you or anyone you know is looking for a part-time job, please send a resume my way.

In the off-season, Dave Brackett, our new Webmaster has been busy building our new website. The website will be used to manage membership/league registrations and volunteer activities, scoring for league play, increased visibility for sponsors and much more. We are hoping to have the website ready to accept online registration as of September 5. This is a little earlier than usual, so we have a little more

time to plan the season. We are considering adding new leagues if there is membership interest. We are also wanting to revitalize volunteerism at the club and are asking members to donate a minimum of 6 hours of their time. Even with a hired bartender, bar support will continue to be an area requiring significant volunteer effort, especially for bonspiels, CurlON events, and rentals. COVID-19 Management

In consultation with the ACC membership and recent government mandate, the Board of Directors has approved a COVID-19 Vaccination Policy for members for the upcoming curling season.

For the 2021/22 season, every member will be required to be "fully vaccinated" with a Health Canada approved COVID-19 vaccine (any combination of vaccines is acceptable) at least 14 days prior to October 3, 2021. Accommodation for people who cannot be vaccinated (e.g., for medical or religious reasons) will be considered, and may include mandatory masking and regularly submitting negative COVID-19 tests.

At this time, members will be required to declare their vaccination status as part of the membership registration process. We will have a table set up

specifically for checking vaccination information (photo ID and 2nd dose receipt) at our Registration Events, as well as at the Clinics and first league nights. Please bring the required information with you. Alternatively, to save time at the door, feel free to send me an email with photocopies of these documents. I will subsequently delete the email. This information will only need to be provided once, in advance of the first time you come into the club (after September 22).

Given the uncertainty around COVID-19 variants, it is our belief that vaccinations alone are not sufficient, and as such, our on-ice protocols will be similar to last season, based on CurlON Guidelines and in accordance with government requirements. Face coverings will be mandatory in the clubhouse except when seated in the lounge. They will be strongly recommended when on the ice except when sweeping or throwing, and only one active sweeper will be permitted to achieve physical distancing. To protect themselves and other members, we are expecting that most will wear their face coverings for most of the time when on the ice. If not and other members feel uncomfortable, league convenors will have the authority to mandate face coverings.

We will be allowing a little more flexibility accessing the club before and after league games, and for bonspiels, CurlON events, and rentals. In doing so, however, we will be enforcing government-imposed capacity limits in the clubhouse (basement and lounge).

In addition to the protocols, the club is equipped with sanitizing supplies, and we have a professional cleaner on contract to provide regular cleaning services. We will be continuing to ask for everyone's cooperation regarding sanitization of high-touch surfaces to help keep us all safe.

To fulfill government requirements for contact tracing, we will continue to use the CurlON app to keep track of everyone accessing the club. QR codes will be issued to members, parents/guardians of junior members, event participants, and employees. Guests will be able to sign-in to the app on arrival.

Our Covid Hotlines (705-250-0320, accovid2020@gmail.com) remain in place and these can be used to report any covid-related concerns or symptoms in accordance with your COVID Declaration.

We are committed to doing our part to keep our membership and community safe. In light of the current pandemic landscape and your feedback, we believe this is the safest and most responsible way forward. If you have any questions or concerns, please don't hesitate to contact me.

To register online, you will need a username and password. If you don't have these, please contact websiteadmin@allistoncurlingclub.com in advance to request them. You can modify your assigned password in the "Edit My Information" section under Members Home/My Information. If you are unable to register online, registration forms will be available at our Registration Events. Please note the Committee uses registration data to notify league convenors and monitor payments.

If you are coming to the Registration Events, please check in with the registration table. We will also have a table set up specifically for checking vaccination information (photo ID and 2nd dose receipt) as noted in Covid Management above.

If you would like access to a locker and/or want to attend the Novice Clinic, please make note of this when registering.

You will notice a "Volunteering" section on the membership form and a "My Volunteering Availability"

section in Members Home/My Information on the website. Every member is asked to donate at least 6 hrs. of time to help around the club. Based on your area of interest, committee chairs will be contacting you with specific requests to help out. Our club relies on volunteers/members to operate and to keep fees low. Please do your part!

We rely on new members to help keep our club financially stable. We encourage all members to help the club by inviting new members to join. Our strong point is our welcoming nature, as new members consistently comment on this. Let's continue to show support for our new and novice members.

The Club is continuing the "Shift Work Special". If you and a partner want to share a membership due to work scheduling, please notify us at the time of registration and register as one name. Also take note, if you are a shift worker, that our daytime leagues are open to all ages, so you might consider taking your own membership and curling in these leagues too.

We continue to offer a two-installment payment method (includes a \$20 surcharge). Payment Due Dates – October 18, 2021, first or full payment; Jan. 7, 2022, for the second installment. Post-dated cheques accepted. Half year fees are also available upon request.

You cannot pay online but, in addition to cash or cheque, we are now accepting payment by e-transfer or credit/debit card at the bar. Note: a 4% surcharge applies for credit card payments only. We will be accepting registration payments at our Registration Events (September 10th and 11th), or at your first curling game. Please respect the fee payment deadlines.
